Upson EMC Linemen restore power after Helene

"It looked like a bomb went off. This is one of the worst storms we've ever seen."

This is how Robbie Davis described what he and four other Upson EMC linemen saw when they arrived in Little Ocmulgee EMC's service territory to repair damages following Hurricane

The Category 4 hurricane reached winds of up to 140 miles per hour, with more than a 15-foot storm surge and was nearly 500 miles wide when it made landfall in the Big Bend region of Florida on September 26. By the time Helene reached Georgia it was a Category 2 hurricane, but was downgraded to a tropical storm over east central Georgia, then weakened to a tropical depression near the Kentucky-Tennessee border. Helene caused

catastrophic rainfall which triggered flooding in Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, Tennessee and Virginia. As of October 18, at least 225 deaths have been attributed to this storm.

Upson EMC's service territory was in the direct path of Helene's projec-

tion, but we were blessed that Helene moved east and spared our area. At the height of the hurricane, we had around 2,000 meters without power. By September 28, all our members' power was restored. Unfortunately, Continued on page 20D
